

Title of Article: An Empirical Analysis of the Effect of Stock Market Crisis on Economic Growth: The Nigerian Case.

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Abstract: Stock market crashes are social phenomena where external economic events combine with crowd behavior and psychology in a positive feedback loop where selling by some market participants drives more market participants to sell.
